State of State address: No Medicaid expansion

On January 12, Governor Sam Brownback delivered his annual State of the State address to a joint session of the Kansas Legislature. During the speech the Governor made it clear he is not in favor of expanding the state's Medicaid program known as KanCare.

Kansas remains one of nineteen states that has not expanded its Medicaid program. Just last week, Louisiana became the 31st state to expand Medicaid. The Kansas Hospital Association has led recent advocacy efforts to convince lawmakers that KanCare should be expanded. [According to the Kansas Hospital Association's website](#), Kansas has missed out on over \$900 million in federal funds since 2014 by not expanding our Medicaid program.

The [KHI News Service reported on the State of the State address](#) and noted that over 150,000 Kansans remain uninsured because the KanCare program has not been expanded.

In his address, the Governor referred to the closure of a hospital in Independence. KHI News Service quoted him as saying, "It was Obamacare that cut Medicare reimbursements to rural hospitals. It was Obamacare that caused the problem. We should not expand Obamacare to solve the problem."

The Affordable Care Act was designed to dramatically reduce subsidies paid to hospitals that serve uninsured people and provide Medicaid coverage for low-income people instead. The US Supreme Court made Medicaid expansion optional for states when it ruled that the states cannot be required to expand their eligibility for their Medicaid programs.

During the State of the State address, Governor Brownback asked Lt. Governor Colyer to head a work group to study the challenges of providing health care in rural areas. This working group was proposed as an alternative to expanding KanCare. The [Rural Health Working](#)

ORAL HEALTH KANSAS

Group members were announced on January 13 by the Lt. Governor.

Last fall, Oral Health Kansas wrote to Governor Brownback and all members of the Legislature urging them to expand KanCare. Expanding eligibility to low-income adults would ensure they are able to access KanCare's preventive dental benefit.

Oral Health Kansas and Sheltered Living to partner in 2016

Sheltered Living, Inc. is a Topeka-based organization dedicated to serving people with intellectual disabilities. This year, Sheltered Living will partner with Oral Health Kansas on a project to educate staff and consumers about oral health.

Through a grant from Delta Dental of Kansas, Sheltered Living plans to host a series of educational workshops in 2016. Oral Health Kansas staff will engage staff and consumers in discussion and activities that allow them to learn how to take immediate action to improve and maintain their oral health.

The new project will help raise the awareness of the importance of good oral health for people with intellectual disabilities, while giving staff the confidence they need to provide follow-up education and assistance for their clients in working towards better oral and overall health.
