Nutrition labeling bill worrisome

The House Commerce, Labor and Economic Development Committee met this afternoon to consider [HB 2595](#). This bill would give the Kansas Legislature the sole authority to regulate consumer incentive items and nutrition labeling for food and nonalcoholic beverages. The bill would prevent any local units of government from labeling food or beverages as healthy or unhealthy, but it would not supersede federal law regulating nutrition labeling.

Five proponents of the bill argued that uniform regulation of food and beverages will benefit businesses from restaurants to vending machine operators and farming operations. Seven opponents of the bill asserted that the bill removes local control, which is a value long-revered in Kansas. The opponents also talked about how broadly the bill can be applied to activities at the local level related to promoting health food and

Oral Health Kansas is engaged in a new project designed to educate schools and students about the health benefits of choosing water to drink, and this bill has the potential to limit our ability to carry out the activities of the project. The committee will consider action on the bill on Thursday, February 18 in advance of an accelerated timeline to conclude the first part of the 2016 Legislative Session. Tuesday, February 23 will be "Turnaround Day," which is the deadline for bills in each chamber to be passed in order to be considered by the opposite chamber. Turnaround Day originally was scheduled for Friday, February 26, but the date was moved up in order to ensure more legislative days are available at the end of the session in the event they are needed.

legislative health committee has been removed from that post.

Last Friday, Senate President Susan Wagle, R-Wichita, removed Senate Public Health and Welfare Chair Mary Pilcher-Cook, R-Shawnee, from that committee and stripped her of her post as Chair after Pilcher-Cook offered an amendment to expand Medicaid believing it would fail. Last November, Susan Concannon, R-Beloit, was removed as Vice Chair of the House Health and Human Services Committee after expressing support for Medicaid expansion.

Wagle has named Sen. Michael O'Donnell, R-Wichita, "interim chair" of the committee, and has moved up Sen. Elaine Bowers, R-Concordia, to vice-chair. Since Pilcher-Cook's removal, seventeen Republican Senators have signed a letter asking Wagle to reinstate her as chair of the Public Health and Welfare Committee.
