New ECP Facebook Page

A new Facebook page about the Extended Care Permit (ECP) for dental hygienists is available. The page was created by ECP hygienist and Dental Champion Patty Martinette in order to connect ECP Hygienists in Kansas and Missouri. The goal of the new page is to share information about how the permits are being used, as well as to establish community contacts to expand the use of the permits.



In 2003, oral health advocates worked together to pass the ECP law in order to establish dental hygiene services in community-based settings such as schools, disability organizations, and nursing facilities. The law has been amended twice over the last 10 year in to expand the populations that may be served by ECP hygienists and to expand the scope of practice for hygienists with a new ECP III permit. The ECP III permit will allow dental hygienists who receive additional training additional training to remove decay, place temporary fillings, and adjust dentures. The first ECP III training will begin this year. 140 Kansas dental hygienists currently hold Extended Care Permits.






