The event, in partnership with Oral Health Kansas and Kansas Oral Health Connections, led a discussion about critical oral health issues affecting the well-being of Kansans. The legislature returned from spring break last Thursday for a very brief wrap up session. The last week of work has mainly focused on school finance and budget negotiations, along with a few wins for healthcare in the state. Both the Senate and the House have approved a telehealth bill, HB 2028, which will require insurance companies to reimburse for telemedicine services similar to how they currently pay for in-person appointments. The bill does not establish a rate of pay though. Dental services were not included in the bill, but we hope to be able to address this next year.

The legislature plans to adjourn on Friday, May 4th.
