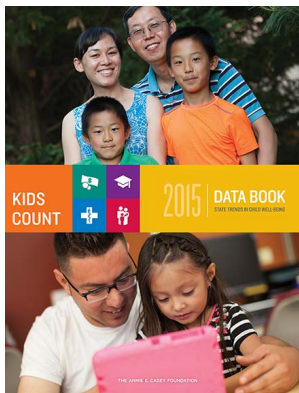


OHK Partners to Improve Oral Health for Seniors

The Johnson County Area Agency on Aging is trialing a pilot project designed to improve oral health of seniors. The target population for this initiative includes seniors receiving Meals-On-Wheels and those attending the six Johnson County congregate meal sites. The project involves the distribution of oral health care kits containing a toothbrush, toothpaste, dental floss and educational cards with tips for maintaining good oral health. Additional support will be provided at the congregate sites by volunteers from Oral Health Kansas who will distribute the kits and provide discussion opportunities about good oral care for interested attendees.

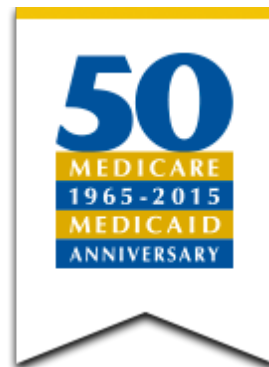
