We know a lot about some of the dangers of smoking, but there's one serious disease related to smoking that you hear less about - even though it is very hard to hide and impossible to ignore: gum disease.



Gum (periodontal) disease is an infection of the tissue and bones that support your teeth. In severe cases, the bone and tissue that hold your teeth in place can break down, leading people to lose many or all of their teeth. The National Institutes of Health [calls](#) smoking "one of the most significant risk factors" for gum disease in the United States. This summer, new [TV ads](#) by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are helping to raise awareness about smoking's link to poor oral health.

Gum disease starts when bacteria on your teeth get under your gums. What are the warning signs and symptoms of gum disease? Red, swollen or bleeding gums is one sign, and this [web page](#) provides other symptoms to look out for.

Smoking not only raises the risk of gum disease, but it can reduce a person's odds for successfully treating this problem. In fact, smokers are twice as likely as nonsmokers to have gum disease. Tobacco use in any form - cigarettes, pipes, and smokeless (spit) tobacco - raises your risk for gum disease. The longer you smoke, the greater your risk for gum disease.

If you smoke, it's never too late to quit. The CDC has a toll-free number that can connect smokers with free help to improve their odds of quitting smoking. If you know someone who smokes, encourage them to call 1-800-QUIT-NOW.

Since 2012, more than 1.6 million people [have called](#) this number to get free info on quitting. Let's do our part as oral health advocates to educate the public and encourage more Americans to quit.
