

# Medicaid Adult Dental Coverage in Kansas

## Why extend dental coverage to adults?

### **Oral health plays an important role in a person's overall health.**

- Poor oral hygiene can elevate chronic conditions such as diabetes and cardiovascular disease. In pregnant women, it can lead to pre-term delivery or a baby with low birth weight.

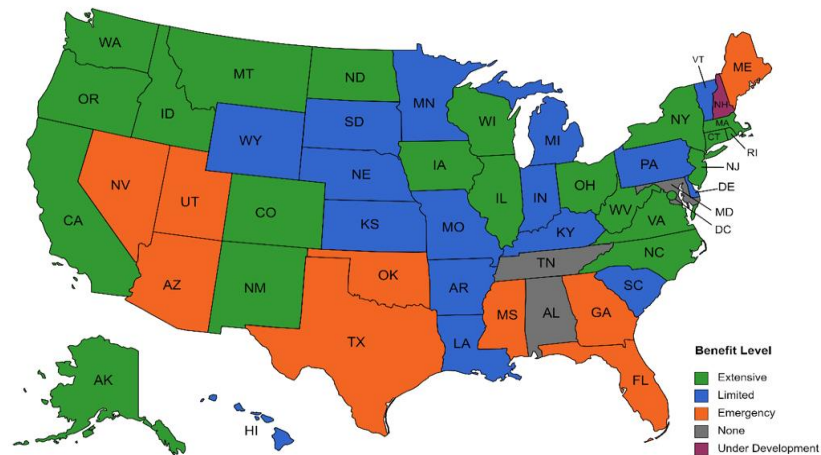
### **Oral health impacts employment opportunities and peer acceptance.**

- The way a person's teeth and mouth look have a big impact on how others view them and how they perceive themselves (Oral Health in America, 2020). This perception has an impact on a person's ability to work, contributes to their social status, and can have an impact on their socioeconomic level in society (Oral Health in America, 2020).

### **Kansas is one of 16 states that has limited adult dental coverage in Medicaid.**



### **Estimating the Cost of Medicaid Adult Dental Benefits in Kansas**

- The American Dental Association's 2021 study, Estimating the Cost of Introducing Comprehensive Medicaid Adult Dental Benefits in Kansas, found the net cost translates to \$0.51 per enrollee per month in state funds. There will be significant savings in medical costs in Medicaid with adult dental benefits. The cost will be negligible by the third year.

### **Summary**

- Comprehensive Medicaid dental benefits will improve overall health conditions. Increased employment opportunities help Kansans leave Medicaid.
