## Meet your presenters:

### **Stephen K. Shuman, DDS, MS**

Dr. Shuman joined the University of Minnesota's School of Dentistry Faculty in 1989 and directs the Oral Health Services for Older Adults Program. In addition to his University positions, he also serves as the Dental Director for both the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation's Senior Dental Program and for Presbyterian Homes of Arden Hills and Roseville, where he also oversees the clinical training in geriatrics and maintains his clinical practice. He also directs the school's nationally recognized continuing education program in long-term care dentistry, "*The Miniresidency in Nursing Home and Long-term Care for the Dental Team.*"

Dr. Shuman served on the board of directors of the American Society for Geriatric Dentistry for 10 years and was President of that organization from 1998 - 99. He has also served as a board member of the Federation of Special Care Organizations in Dentistry and Secretary-Treasurer of the Minnesota Section of the American Association for Dental Research. He currently serves on the Minnesota Department of Human Services' Dental Access Advisory Committee.

### **Peggy J. Simonson, RDH, BS**

Ms. Simonson has been a Dental Hygienist with the University of Minnesota's Oral Health Services for Older Adults Program since 1988 and provides dental hygiene services and administrative support for this program. She received her dental hygiene degree from the University of Minnesota followed by a BS degree focused in Gerontology. She works with the school's community outreach geriatric dental clinics sponsored by both the Amherst H. Wilder Foundation of St. Paul and Presbyterian Homes of Arden Hills, where she also supervises dental hygiene student rotations along with providing clinical care and administrative support.

Ms. Simonson also helps coordinate and is a presenter in Minnesota's nationally recognized continuing education program in long-term care dentistry "*The Miniresidency in Nursing Homes and Long-term Care for the Dental Team*" as well as providing additional presentations on preventive care, geriatrics, and long-term care practice on behalf of the University of Minnesota Continuing Dental Education Program and other sponsors.

**Maggie Smet, RDH**, has practiced in dentistry since 1985. She has experience in dental and surgical assisting, as well as being a Registered Dental Hygienist for 15 years. Maggie is adjunct clinical faculty at the Wichita State University Department of Dental Hygiene. She is currently the president of the Kansas Dental Hygienists' Association.

Maggie has been accepted to the Dental Champions Leadership Program hosted by the Oral Health Coalition of Kansas. After a multifaceted educational program, Maggie will join 20 other Kansans who represent professionals, including dentistry, dental hygiene, education, the not-for-profit sector, government, elected officials, medicine and philanthropy as advocates for improved dental care for all Kansans.

**Marcia Manter, M.A.** is a community development specialist, focusing on developing statewide systems to ensure optimum oral health for Kansas residents. Her work includes recruiting and coordinating the expertise of dental and health professionals, community and state advocates, and government agency staff. She brings to her assignments more than 30 years of strategic and operational planning, project management, conference and workshop design, and curricula development. At the present time, she coordinates the grant-funded project, Extended Care Permits for Registered Dental Hygienists, for Oral Health Kansas.

### **Carla Lehman, Administrator, The Cedars, Inc.**

Carla Lehman received her Bachelors of Science in Nursing from the University of Wisconsin and her Administrators training from Cowley Community College. Carla has been involved in nursing since 1976.
