

Kansas Medicaid Preventive Dental Coverage for Adults



What is required?

- The Medicaid program is required to cover dental care for children
- The Affordable Care Act also requires dental coverage for children
- There is no requirement for dental coverage for adults in Medicaid, Medicare, Veterans Affairs, or the Affordable Care Act



Adult Dental Coverage



Medicaid Dental Benefits for Adults APPROVED!

- Oral Health Kansas led a coalition to successfully advocate to extend Medicaid dental coverage to adults in 2022. The benefit includes restorative and periodontal care.
- Effective July 1, 2022

2022 Adult Dental Benefit Package

- \$3.5 million for new services
 - Fillings
 - Crowns
 - Periodontal Care
 - Silver Diamine Fluoride
- 42 D-codes included
- Effective July 1, 2022

Denture Coverage

- Oral Health Kansas again led a coalition to successfully advocate to extend the Medicaid adult dental coverage in 2023 to include dentures!
- Effective July 1, 2023



2023 Denture Benefit Package

- \$1.2 million for new services
 - Dentures
 - Partials
 - Adjustments
 - Relines
 - Repairs
- 38 D-codes included
- Effective July 1, 2023

Coverage of Denture and Partial Prosthetics for Ages 21 and Older

Effective with dates of service on and after July 1, 2023, Medicaid will cover members ages 21 and older who meet medically necessary criteria for the following dental codes:

Eligibility for the new dental benefits

- The new benefits covered by the Medicaid State Plan are available to:
 - Any adult Medicaid beneficiary who is over the age of 21
 - Adults enrolled in Medicaid generally are older adults, people with disabilities, pregnant people



Value-Added Benefits

- Each KanCare MCO offers a \$500 annual benefit that includes exams and cleanings - this dollar limit ONLY applies to the VABs
- Kansas is the only state with an adult dental benefit that is a combination of state Medicaid plan services and managed care VABs

Include Basic Preventive Dental Care in Medicaid

- Tooth decay and gum disease are preventable
- Routine preventive care like a checkup, x-rays, and cleaning help people prevent these diseases and catch disease early
- Cost of treatment is lower when problems are caught early




Current system is confusing

- Kansas is the only state that uses a combination of VABs and Medicaid services to provide an adult dental benefit
- How the VABs are structured varies by managed care organization and changes each year
- When it is hard to understand how the most essential and basic dental care is covered, providers are reluctant to care for adults



State coverage for basic preventive care

- Over 40 states provide basic preventive dental coverage for adults
- The shaded states all cover exams for adults



A tale of two states

- The state of Maryland implemented Medicaid adult dental coverage in January 2023. This coverage includes basic preventive care. In the first 11 months, utilization of the benefit was 23%.
- In the first full year full year of Medicaid adult dental coverage in Kansas (without basic preventive care), the utilization rate was about 4%.



2024 Policy Request

- Include basic preventive dental care for adults in Medicaid:
 - Exams
 - X-rays
 - Cleanings
- This policy change would allow the managed care organizations to be more creative with VAB options
- Budget hearings in the Legislature begin in February



Understanding the Kansas Medicaid Adult Dental Benefit

In 2022 the Kansas Legislature approved funding to extend dental coverage to adults enrolled in Medicaid (KanCare) and in 2023 the Legislature added funding to cover dentures for adults. This new funding is the biggest step forward in the state's history in making dental care available to some of the most underserved Kansans.

The new KanCare adult dental benefits went into effect on July 1, 2022 and the denture coverage went into effect on July 1, 2023. The coverage includes fillings and crowns, periodontal care, and silver diamine fluoride dentures, partials, and repairs. Transportation to dental appointments for these services is also available. The managed care organizations (Aetna Better Health of Kansas, Sunflower Health Plan, and United Healthcare) will continue to cover exams and cleanings through their value-added benefits.

Who is eligible for the new adult dental benefit?

All people over age 21 who are eligible for Medicaid have access to new dental benefits. Adults who are eligible for Medicaid include people with disabilities, older adults, and pregnant people.

When did adult dental benefits go into effect?

Coverage for fillings, crowns, and gum disease care for people over age 21 went into effect on July 1, 2022. New coverage for dentures went into effect on July 1, 2023.

What services are covered for people 18-20?

The services covered under Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) are in effect for people up to age 21, and then the adult benefits kick in.

Medicaid covers fillings, crowns, and gum disease care, but what about cleanings and exams?

The Medicaid program covers fillings, crowns, and gum disease care, and the managed care organizations (Aetna, Sunflower, and United) cover up to \$500 annually for cleanings, exams, and X-rays.

Are dentures covered?

Yes! Starting in July 2023, dentures, partials, and adjustments are covered. Adults must meet some medically necessary criteria to qualify, including having X-rays. Dentures can be replaced every five years, and people who had dentures before being covered by Medicaid can have them replaced if the dentures are at least five years old.

Non-emergency medical transportation is available for dental appointments

Call your insurance provider three days prior to the appointment and make a reservation

Have the following information when scheduling the appointment:

- Name of the doctor
- Address
- Telephone number
- Time of appointment
- Type of transportation needed (e.g., regular car, wheelchair-accessible van)

Insurance providers like Aetna Better Health of Kansas. Sunflower Health Plan, and United Healthcare will cover those services through value-added benefits.


